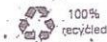

KEY TO SYMBOLS (BIRDS)

- R - RESIDENT: Sedentary species that do not undertake any known or appreciable migration or local movement within the state.
- P - PRESENT: Present at all times of the year, but may be represented by different individuals in winter than in summer. Some individuals may remain in the same general region, but perform local movements. Resident populations may be augmented during the fall and winter months by migrants from outside the state or region.
- M - MIGRANT: Occurs in AZ as part of some migratory pattern typically during the spring or fall.
- V - VISITANT: Wandering or dispersing individuals whose movements do not fit traditional migration definitions.
- Sp - Spring season (March-early June)
- F - Fall season (late July-Nov.)
- Su - Summer season (mainly June & July)
- W - Winter season (mainly Dec.-Feb.)
- i - irregular (irruptive or invasion species)
- l - local (restricted to a small geographic area)
- c - (present in proper habitat in moderate to large nos. annually)
- u - uncommon (present in proper habitat in small to moderate nos. annually)
- r - rare (present in proper habitat singly or in very small nos. annually)
- ca - casual (greater than 5 records, but not occurring annually)
- acc - accidental (5 or fewer records)
- () - seasons this species is more likely to occur
- ? - question (more work is needed to determine status)
- int - introduced
